Bethel Church Council Minutes March 11, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Justin French and Nancy Tilly opened with prayer.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Mike reminded members of the Heart to Heart Banquet on March 19 at the Free Methodist

Church in Vincennes. Bethel has purchased a table for 8 and those tickets are available. He will be serving as Head Spiritual Director for a Women's Emmaus Walk on March 14-17. He has officiated at two funerals, made hospital visits, held premarital counseling, and taught confirmation classes. Confirmands Daniel Leydet, Reegan Hammelman, and Abram Telligman will be confirmed on Palm Sunday, April 14. Pastor Mike and Karen will be on vacation beginning on March 24. Youth Pastor's Report: Twice the youth participated in sorting and packing vitamins for the Nurses on a Mission. The youth traveled to Terre Haute to attend the faith-based movie "Run the Race" which was produced by Tim Tebow. The skating party for elementary kids was held on Sunday, March 10 and was enjoyed by 28 youth. Pastor Mike Leydet is also involved in premarital counseling.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> This report was read and one correction was made. Garland Richter repaired the breaker box after the heavy rain on Thursday, February 7.

<u>Deacon's Report:</u> Stacey Kahre reported an average attendance of 122 and an offering total of \$15,288.50 for the month of February.


