# Bethel Church Council Minutes June 10, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Justin French and Pastor Mike DeCoursey opened with prayer.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mike reported that the number of Community Home residents attending the Sunday service was declining. He and Karen attended the pastor renewal at The Cove in North Carolina. Jim Cymbala from the Brooklyn Tabernacle was the featured speaker. He will be officiating at a wedding in Merom this weekend and he conducted a memorial service for Robert Messel on May 25. He has

been contacted by the leaders of the Bethany United Church of Christ who are searching for procedures to leave the UCC Association. He reminded members of the completion of the Baby Bottle Campaign which ends on Father's Day.

Youth Pastor's Report: Pastor Mike Leydet reported of the final FCA breakfast for this school year. Bethel hosted this, but Mariah Creek Christian Church provided the meal. He participated in the preschool graduation, held a VBS training session and lunch, and helped with the Roundup for VBS for the Freelandville community. Although this activity might not have resulted in a large participation, several registered and it served as an outreach to our community. 72 children attended VBS and 125 bags of coloring books, crayons, etc. to be given to Helping His Hands for children in disaster areas were made. Pastor Mike and Renee will be taking the youth to Spirit Song at King's Island on June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> This report was read and approved. <u>Deacon's Report:</u> Terry Perkins reported an average attendance for May was 150 and an offering total of \$17,310. Other money deposited was from Atlas Gas, Brocksmith Mission, Facility use, the Memorial Fund, and the Cemetery Fund.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Jan Spanger gave the treasurer's report and it was approved as written. She transferred \$2500 into the Youth account. This was a partial sum of a budgeted amount.

Mission Allocation: The following were approved: \$500 to the Christian Campus Fellowship and \$400 to the Gideon's. Elder's Report: Justin French told of serving communion to 128 congregants on Pentecost Sunday and that 168 were in attendance for the June 10<sup>th</sup> service which included a celebration of VBS. Approximately 123 people stayed for the "Come As You Are" VBS celebration cookout.

<u>Buildings and Grounds:</u> Junod Painting has made a bid for the painting and repair of the sanctuary. Rainbow Painting will also be submitting a bid. Wired-Up repaired a light in the secretary's office. Pastor Mike L reported that the glass in the front storm door in the parsonage was broken by the wind and also attention is needed for the septic system.

Two companies will be contacted for bids to complete this work. The storm on June 5<sup>th</sup> resulted in damage to trees and limbs in the grove and cemetery. Cort Bilskie was contacted for this work. Brandon Spanger, Michael Toney, and Terry Perkins donated their time and equipment for most of the cleanup. Our thanks to them, once again. Some of the work for the damage to higher spots and for stump grinding will be done by Cort Bilskie.

Old Business: Ashley Archer attended the meeting to report on building the website. It has been approved for this to be done by Faith Connector. They will be waiving the set-up fee. An annual fee will be charged and this will provide templates to choose from, fitting for Bethel. Some of the services will include the capacity for on-line giving, apps for phones, and streaming services. It will be easy to upload current pictures. The council and congregation still need to choose a logo, one that is immediately recognized as representing Bethel Church. A committee will be formed to continue with this project. It was approved to move forward with these plans. Again, our thanks to Ashley for her work and patience.

Discussion was continued on the comprehensive insurance. A.J. Terrell of Springer Insurance has recommended that we choose Mennonite Mutual as the carrier, as it specializes in insurance for churches and farms. There are essential items to be addressed before the renewal in 2020. One is to have Sexual Abuse Awareness Training for all who work with children at Bethel. Mennonite Mutual provides templates and resources for this training. The change of carriers was approved by the council.

Outdoor lighting and cleaning of the marquee are still items to be completed.

Action Termite and Pest Control have treated the termite problem. There will be another inspection in three months.

<u>New Business:</u> Some of the new business was a reiteration from the Buildings and Grounds report. It was approved to allow Cort Bilskie to finish the cleanup from the storm in the grove and cemetery.

Other concerns are the absence of a handicap accessible bathroom on the main floor, the steepness of the front ramp, the plaster coming down in a classroom and the stairwell, a broken slider sash in the shelter house, and the broken flagpole rope in the cemetery. Several of these items will be repaired at a WORK DAY tentatively set for August 10<sup>th</sup> at 8 a.m. with a lunch served.


