Bethel Church Council Minutes July 8, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Justin French and Terry Perkins opened with prayer.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mike reported that he had conducted the wedding of Brianna (Ainsworth) and Conner Murphy at Merom. He also officiated at the funeral of Mary Deerhake and another at Shaker Prairie. He has a scheduled visit with a member during the coming week. The total of Bethel's share in the baby bottle mission for Heart to Heart was \$2484.

Youth Pastor's Report: The Youth celebrated the beginning of summer break with a trip to Putter's Bay in Washington and went out for supper. We also attended Spirit Song at King's Island on June 20th--22nd. We all enjoyed the park during the day and the excellent Christian concert in the evening. We plan on making this trip an annual event. We also had Youth service on June 30th and had many of our youth in attendance and helping. Pastor Mike will be working a Boys' Chrysalis on August 17-19.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> This report for June 10, 2019 was corrected to read "the total cleanup for the grove and grinding the stumps after the storm was \$2150."

<u>Deacon's Report:</u> Terry Perkins reported an average attendance of 142 and \$21,279 in the offering for June. The replacement cost given for the fire pit which was damaged in the storm was \$1615.89.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Jan Spanger gave the treasurer's report and it was approved as written. She thanked Terry Perkins and Garland Richter for planting the Strate 40 acres. <u>Mission Allocations:</u> It was approved to give the allocated \$1000 to the Women's Guild.

<u>Elder's Report:</u> Justin French asked council members to pray for those shut in and ill. Special prayers are to be lifted for Tom and Joyce Kixmiller. The women of the Guild served 43 family and friends who gathered after the funeral of Mary Deerhake.

<u>Building and Grounds:</u> Stacey Kahre spoke of ongoing or new projects for this committee. The only bid received for the painting of the sanctuary is from Junod Painting. The septic system vent on the roof is plugged. D.C. Metals will be called to replace the broken glass in a window in the shelter house. An old quote from Shekell Plumbing and Heating for a repair **or** for a replacement of one air conditioner that is not functioning for the sanctuary was discussed. The council approved the motion to replace the air conditioner.

Old Business: One ongoing project is the building of the website. The front outdoor lighting has been repaired, but now the dusk to dawn light is in need of repair. marquee sign still needs to be cleaned, the rope on the flagpole in the cemetery needs to be replaced, and the water fountain drains need to be "blown out". The walls in the stairway of Bethel Hall, in the Faithful Footprints Sunday School room, and the historical room have suffered water damage. Terry will contact Mike Knepp again in regard to the repair of the front steps and those at the entrance to Bethel Hall. The floors in the preschool area still need to be waxed before the beginning of preschool. Plans have been in place to contact the person who completed this work last year. The nursery carpet, area rugs in the preschool room, the carpet and stairs in Bethel Hall, and the aisles in the sanctuary have been cleaned by KWIK KLEEN of Loogootee at a cost of \$325. Several projects will be addressed at WORK DAY on August 10th. All are invited to help and lunch will be served.

New Business: Justin asked about Bethel's responsibilities for the annual DUTCH DAYS, usually held in August in Freelandville. The lighting in the social room and sanctuary have been noted as having problems. Some of the ceiling tiles in the social room need to be replaced. The Scholarship committee, Mark and Diane Telligman and Nancy Tilly, presented a letter to incoming seniors of 2020, a new scholarship application, and a list of guidelines for applying for a Bethel Scholarship. These will be sent to

seniors before school begins, with a due date of May 1, 2020. These revisions were approved by the council.


