The meeting was called to order by President Justin French and Brandon Spanger opened with prayer.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Mike DeCoursey officiated at the wedding of Allison and Blaine Rohik on Saturday, September 7. Our Best Wishes to them!

Confirmation will begin on Sunday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Pastor Mike outlined his plan for study. A brief history of Bethel Church, learning to use the Bible through study, concentrating on a deeper meaning of Christmas and Easter, are a few that will help build the faith of the confirmands. Participating are four eighth graders, Carter Lemberg, Russell Harbin, Kaleb Archer, and Kaden Boyles and three seventh graders, Adyn Telligman, Bella Lemberg, and Lilli Phegley.

Pastor Mike led the council in planning Bethel's Church in the Grove and Picnic. 
