The council meeting was opened by President Justin French and with a prayer by Nancy Tilly.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Mike DeCoursey's report for the month of October was of conducting the monthly service at Freelandville Community Home, teaching a confirmation class, and officiating at two funeral services for Fredrick and Son. He made numerous hospital visits to Vincennes and Indianapolis, took a week's vacation, and conducted the Totenfest service. Other responsibilities concerned locating graves, calling for repairs, etc.

Youth Pastor's Report: Pastor Mike Leydet planned the Trunk or Treat evening at the Freelandville Community Center. It was coordinated with the Freelandville Trick or Treat night and both were moved to Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, because of inclement weather on Halloween night. He and Renee took the youth to Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion for a football game and a campus tour. Pastor Mike and Renee served as small group leaders at the ABLAZE Conference on November 9-10. He attended the ENERGIZING YOUR COMMUNITY Conference presented by the Centers for Congregations in Evansville. He announced the postponement of the Youth Chicken and Noodle Dinner until January.

<u>Old Business:</u> The logo has been approved and further plans for this and the website continue. It is a hope that this will be concluded before the end of the year. Ryan Johanningsmeier ordered a replacement eagle for the flagpole in the sanctuary. The search continues for someone interested in any repair needed for the stained-glass windows. The plans for reconfiguration for a handicapped accessible bathroom continue as this project is on the list at Holmes Plumbing.

New Business: Plans for the Christmas season were made. The Preschool Christmas program will be on December 13<sup>th</sup>, so the Christmas tree hunt will be on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> at 9 a.m. The trees will be decorated on Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup> at 6 p.m. December 15<sup>th</sup> will be the Sunday School Christmas Program. A budget meeting will be held early in January before the reports are due for the congregational meeting. Council members were asked to look over committees and be prepared to make suggestions for those for the new year. A nominating committee of Pam Loheider, Sam Miller, Emily Pirtle, and John Spanger will be

asked to search for a deacon and elder for the next term. A new committee for Outreach will be formed for the coming year. The meeting was closed with council members praying The Lord's Prayer.


